Welcome New Players

You may think that your child is not able to participate in a game, but nothing could be further from the truth. Games in special hockey are set up such that everyone can participate. Coaches from both teams match their players with similar abilities. Even those that cannot skate well will be able to take their

shift on the ice. Just come out to one game and you will be amazed how well this works. What is important is that your child participate and feels that he or she is a part of their team.

I would like to take this opportunity to pass on a few things to our new members. While we do have some equipment available we cannot outfit the entire club. Please be at the arena one half hour before the start of a game or practice. You will need the time to help your child with his or her equipment. And please stay at the arena with your child. If little emergencies come up you will be there to deal with them.

While on the subject of equipment please do not expect the coaches to do things like tie your kids' skates. While they do so gladly, it often keeps them from getting on the ice to
